Information For Dr. Momtazi's Skin Lesion/Cancer Patients


This page is designed to provide an overview of your skin cancer treatment.

Overview

- Skin cancer is an abnormal growth of cells in the skin
- Common types include basal cell carcinoma (BCC), squamous cell carcinoma (SCC) and melanoma
- Skin cancer excision is a treatment to remove these abnormal cells from your skin
- Most cases of these types of skin cancer can be cured if they are found and removed early
- If the skin cancer is not completely removed it can come back
- After your skin cancer is removed you will have a scar, which will fade with time

Skin Lesion/Cancer Excision

- You do not need to fast before your procedure
- During your procedure, Dr. Momtazi will use local anesthetic to numb the area around your skin cancer
- Dr. Momtazi will then remove the skin lesion with a safety margin of normal skin around it
- The safety margin of normal skin depends on the type of skin lesion or skin cancer
- Dr. Momtazi will confirm the safety margin of normal skin with you
- All of the skin that is removed is sent to a lab where it is looked at under a microscope by a specialist
- This is done to confirm the diagnosis and/or that all of the skin cancer has been removed



- These results take two weeks and you will be contacted once they are completed
- Dr. Momtazi will close the area using stitches and will confirm if and when your stitches need to be removed
- The procedure takes about 30-45 minutes and you will go home afterwards
- Dr. Momtazi will provide you with comprehensive postoperative instructions to take home with you
- These instructions are designed to help you care for your reconstruction and obtain the best possible results
- It is safe to drive yourself home after your procedure

Complications

- Common complications with this procedure include bleeding, infection and problems with wound healing

Follow Up

- Dr. Momtazi will see you in follow up 1 or 2 weeks after your procedure; he will confirm this with you
- Follow up care is a key part of your skin cancer treatment and safety
- Be sure to come to all of your appointments and to call Dr. Momtazi's office if you are having any problems

Postoperative Instructions For Dr. Momtazi's Skin Lesion/Cancer Patients

Your skin cancer procedure is booked for ______

These instructions are designed to help you care for your reconstruction and obtain the best possible results.

Dressings

Two days after your procedure, remove all your dressings (all tape and gauze)

Showers

- Gently wash all of your skin including the area where you had your procedure daily using mild soap and water
- Any soap is ok, but avoid fragrances
- Do not avoid washing the area where you had surgery; it is safe to do so
- Do not use alcohol or peroxide to clean your skin
- After washing, pat the area dry and leave open to air
- If you wish to cover the area, you may reapply a light gauze dressing
- Do not apply creams, moisturizers, oils, or other products on or near where you had your procedure

Pain

- Pain to the area where you had your procedure is normal and expected
- This pain should improve over several days
- For pain relief, take Tylenol (acetaminophen) and Advil (ibuprofen) together (unless otherwise directed)

<u>Activity</u>

- No strenuous activity (nothing that will increase your blood pressure) for 2-4 weeks
- No lifting greater than 5 pounds for 2-4 weeks
- Activities such as showering, cooking and moving around your home are ok
